Livelihoods on the Tibet-Qinghai Plateau, for long characterized by pastoral animal husbandry, are currently undergoing profound transformations, caused by a multitude of climatic, ecological, economic, demographic, and social factors, as well as by various interventions aiming at environmental stabilization and local livelihood improvement. Locally, the intersection of these processes may have various, both intended and unintended, and sometimes contradictory effects. Local stakeholders, scientists, and policy-makers have become increasingly aware of these consequences and are looking for approaches to support an ecologically, economically and socially sustainable development of the pasture areas. To understand livelihoods in Tibetan pastoral areas, a multidisciplinary approach is imperative, in order to grasp the influence of global, regional and local change processes as well as to identify both new chances and challenges that pastoral societies face in the context of these transformations.

It is, thus, the workshop's objective to bring together expertise on Tibetan pastoral areas, combining various scholarly disciplines such as geography, biology, ecology, economy, anthropology, among others. For three days (September 10-12, 2009), we will bring together an international group of Chinese and western experts to discuss aspects of local livelihoods, livelihood security, change processes, and strategies for the promotion of sustainability. The workshop is understood as a forum for both scholarly exchange and debate with local and regional stakeholders. The workshop is structured by four major conceptual objectives:

1. to analyse, from an interdisciplinary perspective, the multi-layered processes of ecological, economical and social change in Tibetan pastoral areas,
2. to outline repercussions that major transformations have on livelihood security & daily life,
3. to identify potentials, issues, and risks related to social, economical and ecological sustainability that local livelihood systems are facing,
4. to open up constructive debate between scholars, stakeholders (such as local NGOs) and policy-makers, discussing possibilities and strategies how to further support livelihood sustainability.
